# LGBTQ+ RIGHTS

ECHR works to advance the dignity, safety, and equal participation of LGBTQIA+ people across the member states of the Council of Europe by strengthening public understanding, reducing discrimination, and empowering youth and community leaders. Our initiatives focus on improving public understanding of sexual and gender diversity, helping civic and political actors identify harmful rhetoric, and fostering respectful communication in public life.

ECHR also develops inclusive educational approaches that build digital literacy, social awareness, and resilience among people, enabling them to challenge online hostility and cultivate supportive communities. ECHR equips vulnerable LGBTQIA+ individuals to assert their fundamental rights with confidence.



# HOLOCAUST REMEMBRANCE



ECHR projects strengthen Holocaust remembrance by promoting inclusive approaches to memory that highlight histories often overlooked in mainstream narratives. Its initiatives encourage people to explore lesser-known experiences of persecution, displacement, and survival, including those of marginalized groups that have historically been minimized. ECHR connects memory landscapes across the member states of the European Council to deepen understanding of refugee journeys, wartime mobility, and the humanitarian responses that shaped the continent.

Through educational resources, public dialogue, and cross-border collaboration, ECHR works to counter fragmented narratives and reinforce the shared responsibility for remembrance.

# WOMEN RIGHTS

ECHR promotes women's rights by addressing gender-based violence, strengthening women's support systems, and empowering women to advocate for their safety and equality.



ECHR's initiatives raise awareness of the profound social and economic impact of domestic violence, create spaces for collective learning, and encourage cooperation among political leaders, civil society, and community organizations. ECHR also focuses on equipping professionals with the knowledge and tools needed to support survivors, challenge harmful norms, and thus respond effectively to online and offline gender-based hate. By fostering solidarity and shared responsibility, ECHR contributes to building a more equitable European society for women.
